

Maths:

End of Year 4 (May) times table check.

A key priority area of learning for mathematics is quick recall of all times tables up to 12x12.

Week 1: Place value

Week 2: Partitioning, numbers up to 10,000.

Week 3: Comparing and ordering numbers up to 10,000.

Week 4: Rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

Week 5-7: Add and subtract 1s, 10s, 100s and 1000s. Adding and subtracting 4-digit numbers (including exchanging).

Week 8: Measurement (area).

Week 9-14: Multiplication and division, including times tables practice as well as written multiplication methods involving multiplying three digits.

History: Ancient Greece How has the Ancient Greek civilisation influenced our society and culture today?

Geography: Compare the South East of England with Attica in Greece.

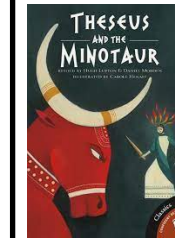
RE: With a focus on Buddhism children will be thinking about 'Is happiness the key purpose of life?'

Key festival - Hanukkah Jewish Festival of Lights

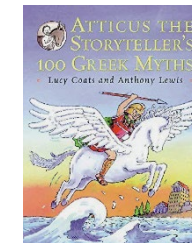
Science: States of Matter Children will be learning about solids, liquids and gases.
